



Pegasus Audition Instructions

We are excited you are interested in auditioning for Pegasus! The audition is a two-step process. First, you will need to submit an audition video no later than **August 23, 2023**. Then, you will be invited to take part in a group workshop held on the first day of the program, **September 20, 2023, 4:30-6:30pm**, showing how well you are able to work as a part of the ensemble.

Please note: the submission process is through Google platforms, so you may find that if your computer is logged in or otherwise connected to an MCPS or other school email address domain, you may have trouble due the permission settings of the schools. Try logging in with a Gmail address.

Step 1: Pick and Rehearse Your Audition Material*

Actors have two options:

- **Monologue** from the choices on page 2. You are welcome to memorize or read the monologue while filming. Please keep in mind, we would love to see your face. Make sure that you practice enough times that you are able to look up at the camera even if you are reading from the text. We want to see you make character choices, take your time with the words, and show us what your character is thinking between one sentence and the next.
- **1-minute short story or joke.** You can share with us a story or a joke that you have rehearsed well. This can be a story from your own life—perhaps share with us about a vacation you went on recently, tell us about your favorite movie, or a story from when you were a little kid. Anything goes! Or a favorite joke! Please keep this short—up to one minute.

*Actors are also welcome to do either of the above using gestural movement only if verbal or signed communication are not an option.

Step 2: Film your performances. A tip: make sure to film from the chest up, so we get a good view of your face and make eye contact with the camera.

Monologue Suggestions

(These pieces are all gender neutral – pick the piece that inspires bold choices and creative ideas)

TAYLOR
